My Status Makes Me Somebody

May 5, 2024 + Psalm 73 with Acts 16:25-34 Part 4 of the series "God Loves Nobodies"

Imagine if church seating was at all similar to traveling by air.
My status makes me somebody. But how do I the right status?
About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. (Acts 16:25)
Paul and Silas were somebodies in God's eyes but they were experiencing
Yet I am always with you; you hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory. Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you. My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever. (Psalm 73:24-26)
But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ (Philippians 3:7-8)
Knowing your status in Christ gives you something to about when you're treated like a nobody.
"Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Acts 16:30)
"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved—you and your household." (Acts 16:31)
Nobodies become somebodies by in the Lord Jesus!
Because of Jesus, we're always Gold Premier in eyes.

Discussion Questions

- 3. How did St. Paul cope with experiencing both "nobody status" and "somebody status"? Look at Philippians 3:4b-11 and 4:10-13 How did he adjust his vision so he ended up seeing things with "Jesus goggles"? (Reference from Matt's book)
